## Fire Awareness at Work

On 26th April 2007, thirty five fire engines and around 150 fire fighters attended the 'New Look' retail store in the center of London. The cause of the fire remains unknown but a subsequent investigation found that a fire risk assessment was prepared on 16 January 2007 by an employee who was not responsible for fire safety. The failure of the risk assessment led to confusion on the evening of the fire.

At a court hearing in November 2009, 'New Look' pleaded guilty to a failure contrary to art. 32(1)(a) and art.9 of the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005, to carry out a suitable and sufficient risk assessment, and an offense under the art. 32(1)(a) and art. 21(1) of the same Order to ensure that its employees were provided with adequate safety training. The judge imposed a fine of £250,000 in respect of the first count and a fine of £150,000 in respect of the second. However 'New Look' appealed the penalty. In June 2010 the appeal court shared the judges original scepticism that "the appointment of a single fire safety advisor for a group of over 600 shops was a sufficient response to the magnitude of the obligation" and that the 'New Look' performance of its fire safety duties, in a large department store in the middle of London, was lamentable. It concluded "the fines were severe, but they were not in our judgment, manifestly excessive and the appeal is dismissed"!
